NEW OFFICERS ELECTED TO THE CONNECTICUT ORTHOPAEDIC SOCIETY

The members of the Connecticut Orthopaedic Society (COS) elected new officers at its Annual Meeting held at the Marriott Hotel in Farmington, Connecticut on May 8, 2015. The officers were unanimously voted to serve the COS from May 2015 to May 2017.

Elected to serve as President of the 250 member Society was F. Scott Gray, MD. **Dr. Gray is a founding partner of Connecticut Family Orthopedics in Danbury** and is a board-certified orthopaedic surgeon. He is the former Orthopaedic Trauma Coordinator at Danbury Hospital and is a member of various professional organizations including the Connecticut State Medical Society and Fairfield County Medical Association. He is a foot and ankle surgeon on the orthopaedic surgery staff at Danbury Hospital. Dr. Gray received his medical degree from Georgetown University Medical School and completed his orthopaedic residency at Tufts New England Medical Center in Massachusetts.
